





# IELTS Academic - Writing



## Task 1 - 150 words (20 Minutes)

- You are given a graph, table, chart, or diagram
- 7 Type of Question - Bar Chart. Line Graph. Table. Pie Chart. Process Diagram. Map. Multiple Graphs.
- Your task is to summarize or explain the visual data.
- Focus on key trends, comparisons, and important details.

## Task 2 - 250 words (40 Minutes)

- You are provided with a point of view, argument, or problem.
- You must discuss the topic with a clear structure and provide your opinion.
- Present a balanced argument with supporting examples.
- 5 Essay Types Question - Discussion, Opinion, Problem & Solution, Advantage & Disadvantage, 2 part Question





# IELTS Academic - SPEAKING

## 3 Parts

### Part 1 (4–5 minutes)

The Examiner asks you general questions about yourself and a range of familiar topics, such as home, family, work, studies, and interests.

### Part 2 (3–4 minutes):

Monologue about any topic.

Preparation Time - 1 Minute


Speak for 2 Minutes

### Part 3 (4–5 minutes)

Extended Questions: The Examiner will ask more questions linked to the topic from Part 2.

Engage in deeper discussions

Explore abstract ideas and broader issues.


